NEW FOOD PANTRY PLANNED FOR CAMBRIA COUNTY AREA

Both the Peter Lemke District Council and the Diocesan Council have approved a proposal to construct a new SVDP Food Pantry in Hastings, PA.

The proposed pantry will replace the one currently located in the rear of the SVDP Carrolltown Thrift Store. The pantry currently serves about 140 families per month. With the construction of the new pantry it is expected to increase that number. The plan will also allow the Carrolltown Thrift Store to expand its sales floor area.

Pantry director, Nancy McMullen, has prepared plans that include the construction plan, cost involved and fundraising to cover the cost of the project. Fundraising efforts are underway and a Go Fund Me site has been set up at GoFundMe.com.

NEW SVDP CONFERENCE IN JOHNSTOWN

The Johnstown District Council has announced that another SVDP Parish Conference is in the works and hopefully will be approved by the Diocesan Council at the August meeting.
