JOHNSTOWN FFF WAREHOUSE DISTRIBUTES CFAB

The **Johnstown Food For Families** warehouse worked with the [Pittsburgh Food Bank](#) to distribute Coronavirus Food Assistance Boxes (CFAB). The boxes contained apples, oranges, cabbage, carrots, iceberg lettuce, potatoes, onions, and yams. Anyone was eligible; there were no income requirements.

ST. BERNARD'S PANTRY FIRST MILK DISTRIBUTION

The [Cambria County Dairy Association](#) is working with **St. Bernard's Pantry** in Hastings to distribute milk to everyone in need. There is no income guideline and anyone can receive the milk.

Distribution of free milk is usually 4,000 gallons but the Dairy Association sent 2,000 gallons for the first give away to make sure the Pantry could handle the volume. The milk was gone in three hours.

Next distribution will be 4,000 gallons with any excess going to other pantries in the area. Distribution is scheduled every two weeks through August and possibly longer.
