REMEMBERING AN AMAZING VOLUNTEER

Patricia (Pat) Trimble was born in Orlean, New York and for most of her adult life called the Altoona area home before moving to Erie, Pennsylvania where she died on April 21, 2020.

Pat held a Bachelor of Science degree in nursing and a Master of Education degree. Pat was a wife, mother, grandmother and great-grandmother. She was a nursing instructor at the Mercy Hospital School of Nursing and an active member at Our Lady of Lourdes Church in Altoona. Along with these accomplishments, Pat co-founded the Gardens at the Hollidaysburg Veterans Home with Tom Ford, Blair County Penn State Co-op Extension Director.

The Gardens at the Veterans Home operated for 32 years until the Home needed the ground for an expansion project. St. Bernadine's Monastery in Hollidaysburg offered ground for a new garden and, in 2008; the St. Bernadine's Monastery Gardens was founded under the direction of Pat and Tom.

Pat used her knowledge as a Certified Penn State Master Gardener to mentor many of the gardeners who rented plots of ground to grow their own vegetables.

In 2015, Pat started a new initiative with the ground. She decided not only to rent plots to individuals but also to raise fresh, healthy vegetables for the St. Vincent de Paul soup kitchen, St. Vincent de Paul food pantry and other pantries in the area. She wrote many grants for this initiative that made it possible to purchase the first high tunnel, a tractor and equipment, and all the tools necessary for planting, weeding and picking.

The Gardens became a special project of SVDP and was renamed [St. Vincent de Paul Monastery Community Gardens](#). This initiative “grows” every year; what a wonderful gift Pat has given to St. Vincent de Paul and to our community.
