The roof on the **Johnstown Family Kitchen** was at least 30 years old. Over the past 10 years the roof has leaked in a number of places so it was time to replace the 6,502 square foot rooftop.

The \$99,100 project was completed in one month. Don Tedjeske, Johnstown Visitation Church Conference President, said, "Fortunately, unusually good weather for this time of year, and the availability of roofers made the job go faster than expected."
